### **January 28                  One Service at 10:00 am**

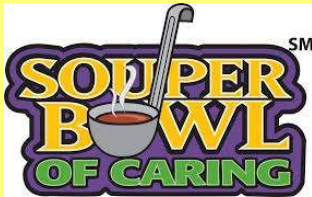
Pastor Dave Preisinger will be our guest preacher. Our many musical groups will participate in this festive worship service. A reception will follow worship.

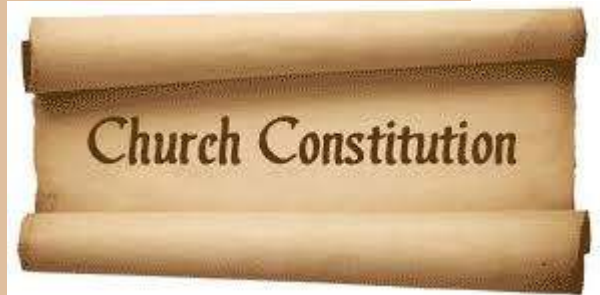
Other January events include a visit from the Bishop on January 13 & 14, and Pastor Paul's last Sunday on January 28th.

January is a full month as Pastor Paul concludes his ministry among us. Here is a summary of important January events:

Details about the Dinner Dance at the Holiday Inn on Electronics Parkway in Liverpool on Saturday, January 13th have been advertised. Come and help us celebrate Pastor Paul's almost 40 years of ministry, and his 30+ years here at King of Kings! We are pleased that Bishop Macholz will be joining us for this event and will also be preaching at both services on Sunday, January 14th.

On January 21, the Annual Meeting will be held and here will be one morning service of worship at 10:45 am. On this day, Pastor Paul will preach his final sermon at King of Kings.

Pastor Paul's last Sunday will be January 28. There will be one morning service at 10:00 am, with Pastor Dave Preisinger preaching. A reception will follow the service.

As we await the name(s) of potential Interim Pastor candidates, the Transition Team has begun a document called the Ministry Site Profile. 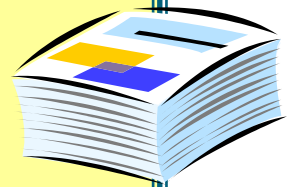


## From your Stephen Ministers...

## Meet Kathy Hill...

As most of you know, my name is Kathy Hill. Kathy for Kathleen, named after my paternal grandmother. My middle name, Amelia, is after my maternal grandmother. I mention this because family and tradition are very important to me. I am one of four children; my parents are in the 80s, still healthy and living active lives, half the year in Florida, half they year 4 miles down the road from me. I have daughter who married her match. They live in Elbridge, and they have blessed me with three incredible grandchildren. I am not at all biased. :-) I moved out to the far reaches of Cayuga County over two years ago, but have continued to find my way back to King of Kings even after the move.

I was baptized and raised in the United Methodist Church in a rather non-traditional setting. That is where I made my confirmation, where I first sang in a choir, first served on a church council. Our church was a small rural congregation and we had student pastors. This meant a change every couple of years and exposure to young preachers as they attended seminary and grew in leaps in bounds. This has given me an overall view of the world that is based in having my feet placed solidly on the ground, as a farmer must, while reaching for the spiritual gifts, available to and through us, as a life-long learning quest.

At 18, I started the process to become a pastor in the United Methodist Church. By 21, life had taken me on another path. Later I joined the Roman Catholic Church and started the process to become a Franciscan Associate. Again, life steered me elsewhere. I have always been active in various churches, always teaching Sunday School or directing youth choirs, singing in choirs, and went on a brief stint as a soloist-for-hire (what an experience!). Finally, I found myself in the narthex of King of Kings Church, on my way into a Weight Watchers meeting, and have continued to feel drawn here since that day almost 5 years ago.

Equally important to me as family and tradition is opportunity for growth. If you listen to me for any length of time, you will hear me talk about the emerging church; about the shift in human consciousness at the time of Abraham; about the additional shift in consciousness at the time of Jesus, Son of God and Man; about Paul's church as we live out our belief in Jesus as Christ; and always asking how we can better live the message of Jesus Christ, growing beyond a life as mere believers.

The **Coordinator of Lay Ministries and Faith Formation** is a role dear to my heart given the massive transitions already in progress here. Facing such uncertainty for the next couple of years, I felt called to step up and help support those who do what they do that make King of Kings the loving, vibrant place that it is. You will hear me talk about how Members Connect - with God (as Trinity), with each other, with the church and with the world beyond the front doors - and you will hear me ask, often, *what do you need to do what you do?*

That's my job, to support the people of this body as we continue on with what's working, adjust and tweak what isn't working, and hopefully introduce additional ideas that can become new ministries that feed us as individuals, as a body of Christ, and as part of the larger community and world around us.

Please, bring me your needs and wants! Meeting the needs will become priority, the wants are what will inspire.

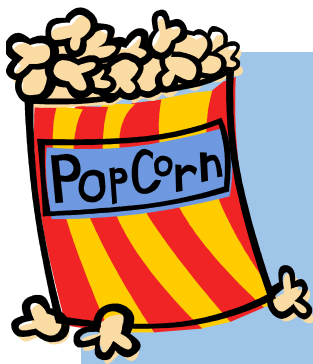
