Greetings from the Deacon's Desk

On May 20, we will confirm four 9th graders as they affirm their baptism. This is a wonderful and exciting time in the life of the congregation. Even more exciting is that our new Intentional Interim Pastor, the Rev. Dr. Julius Carroll, will be here with us to confirm them. Acknowledging that May is a very full month and our attention will be on the beginning of a new chapter in the congregation's ministry, I want to lift up the significance of confirmation.

The journey toward this special day began in the waters of Baptism. By water and the Holy Spirit, we are joined to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We hear these words of belonging, "You are a child of God." We are welcomed into the body of Christ to share in the mission of God's people to proclaim God's creative and redeeming word to the world. From that point our families and congregation begin to live into the Baptismal promises they made to support us in exploring what our identity and purpose as a child of God means for us. At confirmation, we take on a greater responsibility for our faith journey as children of God and acknowledge the continuing work of God in our lives.

When our youth participate in confirmation, they get to publicly affirm their baptism, saying, "Yes, I am a child of God." In a world where our identity and purpose can get lost, confirmation reminds us that we belong to God and to the body of Christ. We are reminded that we are not alone. Confirmation reminds us that we do indeed have a purpose in this life, a purpose that is grounded in the love of God for the sake of others. In affirming their baptism, these four young people will take responsibility for their lives of faith. That being said, the responsibility of their families and the congregation does not end at confirmation. We are God's people together, with a common identity and purpose. We pause on Confirmation day to affirm that we are on a journey together, a journey of faith and promise, a journey with one another and with God who loves and guides us along the way.

I invite us all to hold our confirmands and their families in prayer as they prepare for this very significant step in their lives.

- ◆ Interim pastor of Prince of Peace Lutheran in Greensboro, NC ((after retiring in 2015)

Julius and Geneva are the parents of six surviving children and 16 grands (two sets of twin boys are among them!)

We look forward to meeting you all; as an intentional discernment process is begun to wrestle with what God would have the folks at King of Kings be about in the interim of calling a shepherd to the flock.

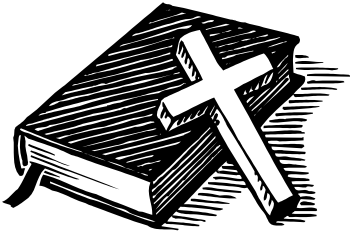
Yoder Chicken and Bake Sale

What are Ministry Teams?

Congregational Ministry Teams are the people who come together in teams recognized by council to do the work of the church. Some teams are required according to King of Kings' constitution, and some arise out of opportunities created by our desire and agreement *to do God's work in Christ's name for the life of the world.*

Some Teams consist of members appointed by Council: Nominating Committee, Audit Committee, Call Committee (when needed...like right now), and Mutual Ministry Team. Other ministry teams are subject to review by Council, and chairs are appointed by council. According to our constitution, these include Christian Education, Stewardship, Property, Evangelical Outreach, Worship and Music, Hospitality and Fellowship. Some of these team titles may seem unfamiliar, as we've updated some terminology and have combined (or separated) teams, but all areas are represented.

Over the next few newsletters, descriptions of various teams will be highlighted. If any pique your curiosity or interested, see a team chair (names on the inside back cover of this newsletter) or Kathy Hill, Coordinator of Lay Ministries. If there happens to be an area of ministry you feel called to and aren't sure where it fits in with the current teams, please inquire!

Global and Local Outreach Ministry Team

King of Kings' Global and Local Outreach Ministry Team is a relatively new team formed by combining the former *Global Missions* and *Local Outreach* teams. We participate in a number of global and local missions and cooperative opportunities, including ongoing giving to **St. Paul's Food Pantry** (located at Brown Memorial UMC in Syracuse), activities with and donations through the Rescue Mission in downtown Syracuse, **CNY CROP Walk, Matthew 25 Farm** in Tully and Lafayette, a community **Thanksgiving Dinner** held here at the church.

We also provide **holiday food baskets** at Easter and Thanksgiving times for the food pantry, have a Christmas Gift tree, make donations and participate in activities with the Refugee Resettlement program through the **Center for New Americans, God's Work/Our Hands Day**, make available **Equal Exchange** products and more.

New opportunities are available with **Operation Northern Comfort** and **Inter-Faith Works**, as well as with additional partnerships we're forming.

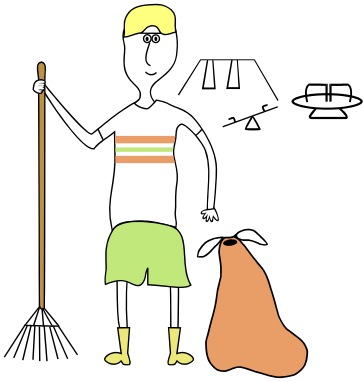
Sunday School Update...

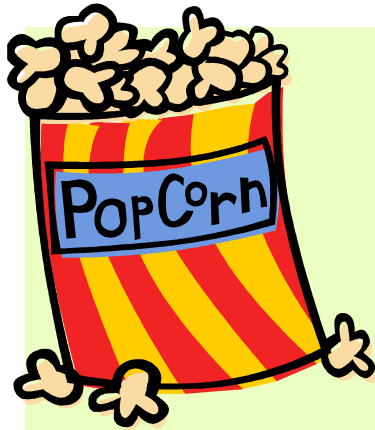

Hello All!

As I sit writing this in early April, I am tempted to look ahead to its publication in May and wish you a happy spring. However, as I sit here amidst the early April snow, that seems ill-advised.

I hope that your Easter season has been a rich time of growth in your relationship with the risen Christ. As we prepare this month to enter the season of Pentecost, I am left thinking of the natural progression of all of Christian life as we see weekly in our liturgy. We enter broken and weary from the world, tired from concerns and heavy-laden with the burdens that we all, in some way, bear. Through the course of our worship, we confess that we have fallen short; we are enriched and enlightened by the Word, fed by the very body of our Lord and sent forth into the world to the work of Christ who dwells into us. In the same way, we celebrate Christmas with the hope of salvation from the burden of sin, we confess and reflect upon our shortcomings in Lent and in Easter we rejoice in God's bountiful mercy and abundant grace.

It follows that in Pentecost we are sent forth to do the work of God, now strengthened by the Holy Spirit. How fitting it is that Church Music Sunday should fall in the same month as this great (if not proverbial) commission! The adult choir, for instance, rehearses just one hour immediately after the 10:45 service; a comparatively small gift of time in return for eternal salvation, I should think.

In any case, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of those aforementioned volunteers, as well as those in musical leadership. Our worship would be greatly diminished were it not for those who give so generously to raise glorious music to our triune God.
