## From the Pastor's Desk

---

### Giving **Thanks** for Our Daily Bread

Martin Luther, in both his Small and Large catechisms, reflects on Daily Bread as not only being food for human survival but also, clothing, shelter, family harmony, justice on the part of government and, peace on our streets; in our nation and round God's world.

ALL these things are what it takes to be made whole; to feel complete as human beings. So, when Jesus says that we should pray: give us this day our daily bread - we are invited to understand that we are asking God for much more than food.

When we pray the Prayer that our Lord taught us we are in essence saying, 'we claim, almighty Parent:

- ◆ that You will provide us with food to enable us to survive
- ◆ that You will provide us with an environment of peace in our lives - outside and inside our homes
- ◆ and You will do all of that - each day of our lives.

Notice in the Lord's Prayer that Jesus uses the adjective 'us' when we ask God for daily bread. Give **US** - not just me - each day our daily bread. The Prayer that Jesus offers as a model is not primarily individually focused but rather, it is a prayer **of** and **for** the community - inside and outside of the institutional church.

You, members of King of Kings, have learned this lesson of the bread being for all. And I give thanks for you as you share God's daily bread through contributions to food pantries; collecting canned goods, household items and Fair Exchange Coffee for the Lutheran World Federation and similar organizations; participating in the Crop Walk for ending world hunger (Church World Service), as well as, feeding hundreds of people within the Liverpool community on Thanksgiving Day.

And so, as we approach Thanksgiving Day, I give thanks to God for my family and the love that they have given me which gives me sustenance. And, to paraphrase St. Paul as he wrote to the congregation at Philippi: "Every time I think of you (King of Kings) I give thanks to (our) God". (Philippians 1.3)

For all of you who are in charge of a committee, or have a budget line, it is that time again to send in your budget line numbers for 2019.

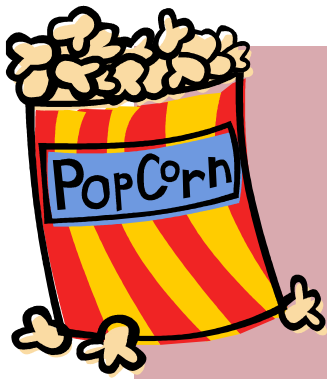
We are asking you to please send your budget requests to Doug Keim.

## Transition Team Update...



The Church Council has taken a final look at the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) and incorporated the learnings from the series of Holy Conversations held over the summer. The MSP was built using data collected from the congregational survey, along with input from the Holy Conversations. We believe that the final version of the MSP provides a thorough and accurate picture of King of Kings for a potential candidate. Thank you to everyone who was part of this process! Council is on track to submit the MSP to the Bishop's Office for approval by the end of November.

The Transition Team will meet this month and hear an update from the newly-formed Call Committee. This will be our last meeting of the year. We will take December off and resume our meetings in January. Our next important task will be starting discuss how we will welcome a new Pastor and help them acclimate to the congregation and the community. Early planning will help to ensure that we have all the bases covered when the time comes to call a new Pastor.

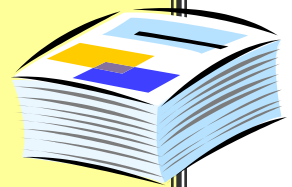

## Greetings from the Deacon's Desk

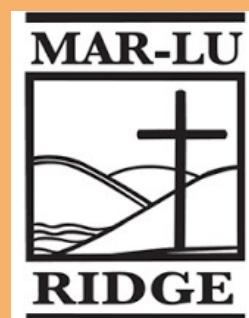
