Mission Statement

"Empowered by the grace and love of Jesus, we are committed to growing in faith with the community."

From the Desk of Pastor Rebecca

For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. (Romans 10:12)

Having grown up in the Upstate NY Synod, the words of its vision statement–recited at many a synod assembly, synod council, and Lutheran Youth Organization meeting–are imprinted on my heart: We are a resurrection people who pray first, walk together, and change lives. At some point during my decade away, this statement was retired... and that's okay! The words didn't go anywhere, and now there is an opportunity to connect to a new way of sharing and explaining the synod's ministry of the gospel.

As a synod, we are encouraged by our current bishop to cultivate a G.R.A.C.E. mindset. The letters of G.R.A.C.E. stand for five discipleship practices: Generous Love, Restorative Justice, Adaptive Leadership, Collaboration & Connections, and Experimentation.

When I think of "generosity," my mind often turns to the story of the loaves and fishes from scripture. Not many stories are found in all four gospels, but something about the way five loaves and two fish fed an entire crowd seems to have struck the ancient writers. There is amazing comfort in the promise that whatever amount we have to offer will be magnified by the power of Christ. Far from an excuse to be stingy, it's a reassurance that we have and are enough to do incredible things. Generosity flows from this kind of freedom!

And "love" often brings my heart to the famous passage from 1 Corinthians 13. Although we frequently hear those words at weddings, I have read them several times at hospital bedsides and funerals. St. Paul tells us that love has power. Love is enduring. Love takes risks, and although it makes us vulnerable, love is what gives meaning to all our faith and hope.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to offer the world the same generosity and love that has been shown to us in our salvation through Christ without distinctions between worthy and unworthy, neighbor or stranger, sinner or saint. The Rev. Dr. Jacqui Lewis has a guiding question she counsels Christians to live by: "What would love have me do today?" That is a question that can guide us in our church, in our homes, and in our communities.

Among your co-workers, what would love have you do today? With your children or parents or siblings, what would love have you do today? In the grocery store or the waiting room at the doctor's office or at a school board meeting, what would love have you do today? I encourage you to dwell with that question and listen for how the Holy Spirit answers you.


Sunday School & Stepping Stones News for Families from Sue
