Squares and rectangles of fabric have been sewn together into equal sided square blocks. With each block being sewn into rows, there should be an equal number of blocks in each row, right? Nope. There are different numbers of blocks in each row. How does that work to set blocks into a quilt with all these different numbers of blocks in the rows? Here is the answer to this complicated math problem, the rows are on a diagonal. The ends of the rows will have a triangle sewn to the end blocks to (hopefully) make even edges on the sides

Food for thought from Psalm 139: 17-18. (NIV)
17 How precious to me are your thoughts, God! How vast is the sum of them!
18 Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand—

when I awake, I am still with you.


Imagine a handful of sand, and you can't even start to count all the grains. The Bible says that God thinks so much that we couldn't even count God's thoughts if we used all the grains of sand in the whole world! God has tons of ideas for us to make the world a better place. It takes all of us working together using what we know to get all of God's work done. That's how it works in our families, in our church, and even in our town. We need each other. God wants us to work together, to share what we know to get the job done. I ask you to think about how many ideas God has for us to bless people, and then ask God what you can do to help in our new Children's Message.

If we paraphrase the last phrase of the verse, "We need each other to get God's work done. God is big."

As I mentioned last month, change is not easy. As we search for a new Faith Formation Director, I invite you to get involved with the new Children's Message time during church. This is an old idea from Pastor Paul's time and a new idea since it will replace the current Sunday School time. It is an idea, and hopefully this is an idea that will meet the children attending church's needs. My goal is that it will be based on one of the readings during the service, and will include an interactive exchange between the children and the puppet, and follow-up activities to be completed independently at the children's table, to be taken home to complete later in the week. This dialogue can also help adults better understand the meaning behind God's word and how it can apply to our lives.
