Mission Statement

"Empowered by the grace and love of Jesus, we are committed to growing in faith with the community."

From the Desk of Pastor Rebecca

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings should be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. (1 Timothy 2:1-2)

Political strife, competition, and even violence mean it feels as if we live almost constantly in "election season." I cannot think of a time in the past decade or so when our nation has not been hypervigilant about who is in charge, what laws are being passed, and what court decisions are being handed down. As soon as one election/inauguration cycle passes, we begin talking about the next one. But this is the final month before Election Day on Tuesday, November 5, and knowing that it is a time of high stress and great civic importance, I offer you this advice and reflection in the spirit of pastoral care and guidance.

First, reduce or eliminate your use of social media. It's now impossible on most platforms to avoid AI-generated content and advertisements on our feeds. If social media helps you stay connected to loved ones, try to use phone calls, text messages, emails, or even snail mail. Companies make money by having us click on their stories or even pause over them as we scroll, meaning they have a financial incentive to shock and outrage us. Furthermore, disagreements on social media have a way of quickly growing out of proportion and fostering hurt rather than relationship.

Second, please vote if you are eligible. If you need help making a plan to get to your polling place or obtaining an early or absentee ballot, now is the time to ask! We are extremely blessed to live in a country where the freedom to participate in a democratic process of governance is so widely available. Apathy and hopelessness are temptations that we, as disciples of Jesus, are called to resist. Voting can be a sign of engagement, hope, and investment in our collective future.

Third, be prayerful. Scripture calls us to pray for our leaders, that they would govern in a way that makes it possible for all to live peaceful lives with dignity. The tradition of the prophets also teaches us to speak forthrightly to our leaders about their responsibility to protect the vulnerable and steward wealth justly. Be bold to invoke the wisdom of the Holy Spirit in your discernment.

Fourth, remind yourself that there are many ways to impact our local community and our nation beyond federal elections. Local elections matter. Volunteering at soup kitchens matters. Donating to nonprofits matters. Building a friendship with someone of a different faith or racial background matters. Contacting your elected officials during their tenure as president, or senator, or representative matters! In fact, next time you're tempted to mix social media and politics, I challenge you: instead, spend that time calling or emailing a government figure about that topic.

Like almost every pastor I've ever met, I truly have no desire to tell you who to vote for. What I do desire to do is remind you that civic life, electoral politics, and voting are tools we are entrusted with for the sake of caring for our neighbors. Our discipleship is grounded in love, service, and mercy—all of which is empowered by the grace of Jesus Christ. In this season, and in every season, may those be the values that prevail in our nation and around the world.

From an editorial of "The Gospel Coalition":





Interested in a Group Discussion about "The Chosen"?

"The Chosen" is a series about the life of Jesus Christ, his disciples, and other people surrounding him. The series stays true to the gospel accounts of Jesus' life, teachings and miracles, but the back-stories of the disciples and others are fleshed out and told in interesting ways and, at times, even with humor. In episode one, we meet Mary Magdelene, the fishermen--Simon, Andrew, James and John—Matthew, the tax collector, and Nicodemus. The series shows them prior to their meeting Jesus and how their lives are profoundly changed after they meet him.

Each episode is 50 to 60 minutes long. You may watch the episode at home before we meet, **but** there will also be an opportunity to watch it at the church where it will be shown one hour prior to the discussion group. We will be starting with season one, episode one, moving to another episode each week for eight weeks. We will meet in the church parlor to discuss what we saw, thought, and experienced while watching it.






Super Steward!!

The council approved property and grounds improvements to the shed including a new roof and concrete slab. The parking lot is being monitored, and will need improvements in the near future.




Council also approved funding for updated furnishings to be used in the nursery.







Mark Your Calendar: October 20, <u>after service</u>, the children will participate in Backpack Sunday, where children will stuff backpacks for children abroad, and pick apples for the food pantry at Atonement Lutheran Church.

Here is a sample Children's Time lesson, in case you are wondering how you might get involved. It is a dialogue between you and the children. This is from Peter's Faith lesson, Mark 8: 27-38.

Does anyone here wear a cross? What does wearing a cross mean to you? (being a Christian, belonging to God)

Crosses are important to us as Christians because they tell something about who Jesus is. Hold up the cross jewelry. The cross tells everyone that Jesus is our Savior. It reminds us that Jesus died on a cross to save all of us. In today's story, we heard more about how Jesus is our Savior.

Talk about these questions:

- If you see someone wearing a cross, do you ever ask about it?
- Besides seeing crosses on jewelry, where else do you see them?
- Is it hard to talk with your friends about who Jesus is? Why or why not?

Dear Lord,

Thank you for Jesus and all that he did for us.

Help us to share your love and the good news of Jesus with our family and friends.

We pray in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Invite kids to make the sign of the cross.
